**Conditions:**

- Two adults must be present at all times.
- All girls who participate as baby sitters must have completed a recognized baby sitter course, *for example* the courses offered by Red Cross, Camp Fire, or Seattle Children's Orthopedic Hospital. No children with special needs can be accepted unless the girls have completed the appropriate specialty baby sitter classes.
- Girls must be at least twelve (12) years old in order to baby sit.
- Girls cannot baby sit infants. (All children being baby sat must be walking.)
- A reasonable balance will be maintained between the number of girls providing baby sitting services and the number of children they are baby sitting. Children will be turned away if the number exceeds what the girls can reasonably handle.
- The organization or company for which the troop provides baby sitting services must have proof that they carry liability insurance of their own.
- Non member insurance has been obtained through GSTC to cover the children being baby sat and parents who drop them off.

## **GIRL SCOUTS-TOTEM COUNCIL RULES RELATING TO TROOP BABY SITTING AS A MONEY-EARNING ACTIVITY**

Troops that want to undertake baby sitting as a money earning activity, as described in *Safety Wise*, may do when the following conditions are met:

- Two adults must be present at all times.
- All girls who participate as baby sitters must have completed a recognized baby sitter course, *for example* the courses offered by Red Cross, Camp Fire, or Seattle Children's Orthopedic Hospital. No children with special needs can be accepted unless the girls have completed the appropriate specialty baby sitter classes.
- Girls must be at least twelve (12) years old in order to baby sit.
- Girls cannot baby sit infants. (All children being baby sat must be walking.)
- A reasonable balance will be maintained between the number of girls providing baby sitting services and the number of children they are baby sitting. Children will be turned away if the number exceeds what the girls can reasonably handle.
- The organization or company for which the troop provides baby sitting services must have proof that they carry liability insurance of their own.
