Planning Trips to Canada

- Custodial Parents/Guardian and leaders fill out this form (#3250). Parent retains one copy (bottom: yellow). One copy goes to emergency contact (middle: pink) and one goes with the leader on the trip (top: white).
- Everyone on the trip must have the following information when going through customs in Canada and the United States.
 - Signed Activity Permission Form for Entering Canada #3250 (one for each girl)
 - Valid U.S. passport or original birth certificate (or notarized copy) and photo ID
 - Adults/girls who are non-U.S. citizens must present a valid passport and in some cases, a visa. Call the Canadian Consulate with questions.

- Permission for your trip must be received from your service unit manager, using form 2610 for day trips and trips of 2 nights or less: or form 2611 for over two nights.
